CITY OF PEARLAND ALARM ORDINANCE SUMMARY

Pearland City Council adopted Ordinance Number 569 to address the high number of false alarms that are generated and the excessive costs associated with this problem. As a part of this ordinance, all alarms that are installed in our community must be registered. This requires a nominal one-time registration fee (unless the property is sold or it is for a non-profit organization) and provides for fees to be assessed for locations that have excessive numbers of false alarms, as established by the ordinance.

In order to see that your alarm system is properly registered, you should follow the below listed process:

- a. Obtain a registration application form from the City of Pearland, Permit Office at 3523 Liberty Drive.
- b. Pay a one time registration fee (\$5.00 for residence; \$20.00 for Commercial; Non-profit organizations exempt).
- c. Fill out registration application completely and return it to the address at the bottom of the form.

For your information, some of the highlights of the Alarm Ordinance are listed below. These are paraphrased comments. For exact wording, please refer to the actual ordinance.

- 1. All alarms are required to be registered. Failure to do so could result in a fine.
- 2. If a business or residence has two separate alarm systems, they must obtain two different permits.
- 3. Persons in control of property on which an alarm system is installed is required to receive notification of an alarm activation at any time, come to the alarm site within 30 minutes if requested by the police, grant access to the alarm site, deactivate the alarm if necessary, and train all persons who may activate the system.
- 4. Any changes or modifications in the original alarm Registration Form (new employees, persons to be notified, etc.) must be made, in writing, within 72 hours of the change. This change can be sent directly to the Police Department to the attention of the Alarm Detail.
- 5. Alarms are required to have a source of stand-by power to automatically maintain the system in a normal condition for a period of four hours in the event of the interruption of the primary power source. (This is usually in the form of a battery and is usually included in most alarm installations.)
- 6. Persons who are in control of alarmed property shall insure that the alarm system is repaired within 72 hours after formal notification by the Police Department or monitoring company that it is malfunctioning.
- 7. No telephone dialers that automatically call any police department telephone line may be installed on any alarm system.
- 8. No person may conduct any test or demonstration of an alarm system that would require a police response without first notifying and obtaining permission from the Police Department.
- 9. Any location that has more than five false alarms in a twelve month period (beginning January 1st of each year) will be charged the cost determined for a response by the City:

If these fees are unpaid, a summons to Municipal Court will be issued to the permit holder or owner/occupant of the premises.

The problem of false alarms can be very costly in terms of the potential for the property damage, injury to officers and injury to others during an emergency response to what turns out to be a nonexistent problem. Over 95% of all alarms reported to the police department are false, many of these are a result of a few locations failing to correct long existing problems. We appreciate your understanding and recognition for the need of this type of an ordinance. This will allow the Pearland Police Department to more efficiently and safely serve the needs of all the members of our community.
